



E R's MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

First, let me apologize for the delay in the release of this newsletter. Given the activities at the end of August and fair parking, it was unavoidable.

Well, September is here; may the temperature and humidity be more in the normal range. It's hard to believe that summer is almost gone. It was a crazy August. It started with a Cruise---in on Sunday, August 5th. From 8 to 11 that morning, over 30 vehicles attended: trucks, classic cars, low riders, muscle cars, and a motorcycle. The oldest I believe were a Model A and a 1936 Oldsmobile with all original parts. It was pretty awesome seeing all those vehicles.

On Saturday, August 18th, we hosted the 1st North Hudson District Deputy clinic for our own DDGER Christopher P. Akers. Anne Leiser, Robin Howes and their crew provided a wonderful buffet breakfast. As this clinic was open to all Elks, it was great to see so many from our lodge attending the clinic. I encourage everyone to attend the remaining clinics to see what the district is all about. The following day, we were supposed to have a Lodge initiation for four new members. However, we had to postpone the event due to the cleanup activities resulting from the night of Friday, August 17th. For those of you unaware, the basement flooded twice due to the heavy rains that evening. Gordie Engel first noticed it around 7:55pm just prior to meeting with the four new members. Richard Fisher, Jerry Shook, Chris Akers, Rick and Sandi La Crosse, and I got the waters out of the basement as the water receded. Then another pour flooded it again around 9:15. We finished removing the water, the best we could, around midnight. After the District Deputy clinic, the basement was inspected and it was decided to get a professional in with all the necessary equipment to get the moisture out of the wood and sheetrock, as well as the carpeting.

The following weekend, we had a party in the pavilion on Friday, August 24th and a wedding in the Pavilion on Saturday, August 25th. Then on the 26th, there was a Kids---ID breakfast in tandem with the State Police. Even Elroy, the Elks mascot, made the visit. And then there was the Columbia County fair from Wednesday, August 29th thru Labor Day, Monday, September 3rd. I cannot say it strong enough how important this event is for our lodge; not only from a financial perspective, but also from an image perspective as well. Here are a couple of facts that members may not realize. The first is that in six days of fair parking

we earn more than what we do in 5 YEARS (250+) of Sunday breakfasts. This allows us to give back to youth, veterans, and seniors of our community in so many ways that normally wouldn't be possible. The other fact is that there are 174 shift positions, each lasting only 5 hours, that need to be filled in order to adequately cover the parking. With a membership of 370, those 174 shift positions should be covered without difficulty. Unfortunately, for the past couple of years participation has averaged around only 75 people, putting fellow brothers, sisters and their friends through unnecessary hardship, as well as keeping them away from family and friends during the holiday; some individuals doing at least 2 shifts each day for all 6 days. I would like to thank the 'Core Four' of Chris Akers (DDGER), Jerry Shook (PSP), Joe Laviano (PER), and Denny Williams for organizing this event. I cannot thank enough those members and volunteers that gave their time for this. Even if I could list all those 75+ individuals without missing one or two, we probably would add a page to this newsletter. So instead I'd like to mention a couple of individuals that really touched me in their efforts. First, is Robert 'Whiskers' Hawver. Besides being there every morning, due to the shifts being short staffed, he spent the last two days parking cars, being out on the lot, essentially without any shade in the heat and humidity, walking through the field guiding cars to park. One other person, Francis McKerrin, spent an entire day parking cars while having just moved his daughter to college for her freshman year. Finally, I'd like to thank Tom Migglia for putting together signs for the carts and to Anne Leiser for having the 'clink' bags at the Fair. We collected over 3 full bags of bottle returns, in which all proceeds go to our Veterans committee.

As for our lodge, this month has a few activities planned. First, is the lodge's Worker's party will be on Saturday, September 8th from 4 to 8pm. We are having a Pig Roast provided by Tim Lyons at 6pm. Mike's Music Box will be the DJ for the evening. Beverages included are draft beer and two (2) drink tickets. The committee is welcoming people to bring something to pass around to enhance the offerings; like desserts, appetizers, a special dish, etc. On Saturday, Sept 15th we are having a Soc---Hop. That means get your poodle skirts out or slick back your hair and jump into your classic car. Cars can show up starting at 4:30 and live '50's band' at 5pm. Food and beverages will be available. There are prizes for best car and best dressed. Next, is that the Elks Scholarship program has begun once again. These scholarships are open to high school seniors who plan on going to college. Up to \$50,000 per year for 4 years could be won. This year Kinderhook had 2 scholarship winners of \$1,000.Continued on page 3
