Abby's Chocolate Delight

1st Layer

1 Stick Softened Margarine
1 Cup Flour
½ Cup Finely Chopped Nuts

Combine all 3 ingredients and press into the 9x13 pan.

Bake 15 minutes at 350-degree oven and cool.

2nd Layer

1 Cup Powdered Sugar
1 8oz Pkg Softened Cream Cheese
1 Cup Whipped Topping

Stir powder sugar, cream cheese and whip topping.

If it comes out too thick, you can thin it down by adding a little milk. Spread over cooled crust.

3rd Layer

2 Pkgs Instant Chocolate Pudding
3 Cups Milk

Beat instant pudding mix and milk until thickened.

Spread over second layer.

4th Layer

Additional Whipped Topping

Spread over 3rd layer.

Refrigerate.



Famous advice for veterans service volunteers

President Harry S. Truman reportedly said, "It is amazing what you can accomplish if you do not care who gets the credit." That's particularly good advice for volunteers looking to serve veterans.

According to the IRS, there are more than 45,000 non-profits in veterans service in the United States today. Working together may be the only way to solve problems for our nation's veterans.

For advice on how to start and build good partnerships, we sought advice from Darrell Quinley, a Member of Grandview-Hickman Mills, MO Lodge No. 2088. As a representative at both the Kansas City

VA Medical Center and the St. Michaels Center (which provides veterans with safe, stable housing), Quinley knows that partnerships are key to accomplishing goals.

Here is his wisdom, gleaned from years of volunteering for veterans and working as a funeral director.

- Smile. Be upbeat. Find as much common ground as you can with family, children, activities, veterans in the family, etc.
- Don't take up a great deal of their time at the onset. Ask for their business card and follow up a few days later.
- Don't give up! First or even second

impressions may not be a true indication of future working relationships.

- Be truthful, be consistent, and be prepared.

- Try to always take the high road on any contentious discussion, or better yet, avoid it completely.

- Be complimentary. Thank them for what they do. Find no fault in their operation.

- Tell them you have Elks Members just waiting to help veterans.

Above all, go in with a positive attitude. Your heart shares their heart in the love of service to veterans.

Charles I. Noonan age 82 passed away peacefully on Saturday morning June 29, 2019 in the Saint Luke's Nursing Home, New Hartford. He was born on October 10, 1936 in Little Falls, son of the late Andrew F. and Charlotte Hall Noonan. Chuck was raised in Dolgeville and was a graduate of Dolgeville High School. He served in the United States Marines Corps as a Tank Commander in Okinawa with the 8th Tank Battalion, FMF, CLNC. When he was honorably discharged, he held the rank of Sergeant.

He was a fifty-three year member of the Herkimer Elks Lodge # 1439 where he was selected as the 1972-1973 Elk of the year, he progressed to the position of Exalted Ruler for 1977 to 1978, in 1982 he became Lodge Secretary a position he held for many years, he served as the State Vice President of the New York State Elks Association representing the Central District for the 1985-1986 Fraternal year. He served as District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler 1988-1989, New York State Elks Association Ritual Chairman from 1990 to 1992, New York State Elks Association State President 2001-2002 and Grand Lodge AREA 1 of the Grand Lodge Ritual Chairman. He was head coach of the Herkimer Lodge # 1439 Ritual team that had the distinction of being State Champions for five consecutive years in a row 1997 through 2001; two-time National Runner Up and won the National Championship in 1997.

Reminder to Submit Your Scholarship

Most Valuable Student:

Applications will open August 5th.2019. The deadline for submitting applications is November 5th at 11:59 PM Central TimeZone. Follow the link below to see the announcement.

The 2020 Most Valuable Student scholarship contest is open to any high school senior who is a US Citizen. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants need not be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are signed; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

The application deadline is November 5, 2019 at 11:59 PM Central Time Zone.

Awards:

- The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2020 competition.
- Male and female students compete separately.
 - Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.
 - The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation will announce the 2020 500 national winners in late April 2020. (Many local Lodges, districts and state Elks associations award their own scholarships through this program. These scholarships are not to be confused with the 500 Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarships.)

The 20 top finalists will participate in an all expenses paid [Leadership Weekend](#) in Chicago during which they'll interview with the national judges. These 20 finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive awards of \$20,000. The 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000.

Legacy Award:

Applications will open September 1st, 2019. The deadline for submitting applications is January 21st at 11:59 PM Central TimeZone. Follow the link below to see the announcement.

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility requirements are outlined below.

The Foundation will offer a total of 300 awards in the 2020 contest.

The Elks National Foundation is proud to present its 2019 ENF Legacy Awards recipients.

The 2020 contest will open on **September 1, 2019**.

The deadline for applications is **January 31, 2020 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time**.

Read below for eligibility information and answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

Who is Eligible?

1. For the 2020 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2017, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2017, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2020. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.
2. The applicant must be a high school senior.
3. The applicant must apply online only. The 2020 Legacy Awards application deadline is January 31, 2020 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.
4. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.
5. Applicants must take the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or the American College Test (ACT) in time to receive their scores before the application deadline by December 31, 2019.
6. Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student qualifies for more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.
7. Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

If you are selected as a 2020 Legacy Awards recipient, you will be required to perform service once a year with an Elks Lodge during the four years you are receiving the scholarship. [Click here](#) for more information about serving with the Elks.

How Do I Apply, and What Are the Deadlines?

Eligible students should apply in the following manner:

1. The student must complete and submit the ONLINE application. The 2020 Legacy Awards application deadline is January 31, 2020 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.
2. The Elk sponsor's membership will be verified through the BPOE Grand Lodge headquarters.
3. When a student registers to complete the online application, both the applicant and Lodge Secretary will be notified by email.

Upon receipt of the application, the applicant will receive a notification that the application was received. Winners will be announced in late April 2020.

Note: Because the contest begins in one Lodge year and the winners are announced in the next, a Legacy Award could go to the child or grandchild of a lapsed member. An applicant's Elk parent or grandparent must be a paid-up member in good standing at the time of application, but if the Elk chooses not to renew membership, that decision will not affect the outcome of the Legacy Awards contest.

Emergency Educational Grants:

Also, don't forget about Emergency Educational Grant that provides financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks.

Emergency Educational Grants provide undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$5,000. The grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education. Grant amounts are based on the information submitted in the application and can range up to \$5,000.

- As long as a student meets all other eligibility requirement listed below, a student can apply for up to four Emergency Educational Grants in total during their undergraduate education.

The applicant cannot accept more than one ENF scholarship/grant in any one academic year.

Eligibility:

The Elk parent or stepparent:

Must have been a member in good standing for at least one year at the time of his or her death.

or

- Must have been a member in good standing for at least one year before he or she became totally disabled and must continue to be an Elk in good standing when application for assistance is made. All circumstances surrounding the death or disability of the Elk parent or stepparent are subject to the review of the Elks National Foundation. The outcome of the review may effect grant approval.

The applicant must:

- Demonstrate financial need.
- Attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student.

**Note that if a student is awarded an EEG, the funds are disbursed directly to the school in the student's name and can only be used for items the school considers cost of attendance. This normally includes tuition, on campus room and board and books and fees. Learn more about the ENF's scholarship guidelines [here](#). **

Be unmarried, under the age of 24 during the academic year in which they are applying.

Applications:

- Available upon request between **May 1 and October 31** of the academic year for which assistance is desired.
- Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

Elks History

The Benevolent and Patriotic Order of Does - A group of women of Omaha, Nebraska, wives of Elks, discussed the forming of an order with similar ideals and precepts of the Elks. So enthusiastic did they become that on February 9, 1921, invitations were extended by Mrs. James H. Craddock, to sixty women in Omaha to meet at her home, 3716 Hawthorne Avenue, for the purpose of laying the foundation for the Order.

Although independent, this organization would be in harmony with the Benevolent and Patriotic Order of Elks and organized along similar lines, with its membership to be confined to wives, widows, mothers, daughters, and sisters of Elks. Thirty-two women were present at this first meeting and a temporary organization was formed that day. These women met for six months until Omaha Elks Lodge No. 39 graciously invited the DOES to meet in their Elks Lodge Room.

A firm was employed to prepare the necessary papers and Constitution. The Grand Lodge was formed and chartered on February 12, 1921 by the State of Nebraska with authority to charter subordinate lodges, called "Droves" These ladies, with the assistance of the Elks, and with the desire to work in harmony with and to always keep uppermost in their minds the idealism of Elkindom, laid the foundation for a permanent organization dedicated to the principles of Patriotism, Charity, Loyalty, and Love. It was a trust, hope, and ambition that this organization would spread in ever-increasing circles and, in the fullness of time, a Drove of DOES would be in every city where there is an Elks Lodge.

The Benevolent, Patriotic Order of Does filled a need for a national women's organization whose members met specified requirements and shared mutual interest with the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. The Officers of a Drove serve annually as follows: Elective: President, First Counselor, Senior Counselor, Junior Counselor, Secretary, Treasurer, Conductor, Inner Guard, Outer Guard, Musician, and three Trustees. Appointive: Chaplain, Assistant Musician, Assistant Conductor, four Color Bearers, and four Attendants. Membership into our Order is by invitation of a Doe, who is the Proposer. The application must be signed by the Proposer and two Members of the Drove, who are References, as well as by an Elk Sponsor, other than the Applicant, who must be an Elk in good standing. An Applicant must believe in God, be an American citizen, and have attained the age of 21. Additionally, the Order is non-sectarian and non-partisan.
