

It's possible to both honor history and pass the torch

As many of us grow older, and as our minds create more and more memories, we find great pleasure in reminiscing to anyone within earshot.

Truth be told, many Elks like to play "Once upon a time," where we begin to tell our captive audience about how things used to be when we first joined our beloved Order. Sometimes, those who listen are shocked because they really believe we are older than dirt and shouldn't be able to remember anything, or they become confused because they can't fully comprehend what we are talking about.

This often happens when we tell our new Members about the Ritual and the many changes that have occurred over the years. Recently initiated Members typically ask questions such as, "Officers had to memorize what?" "Why?" "What is Thanatopsis?" (This might be a good one to look up) That same look of disbelief also occurs when they see pictures of Elks from decades ago when men always wore suits and ties and women wore long dresses to our official Elks functions and

social affairs, or even pictures from a short time ago in which there are no females in the Lodge officer portraits simply because there were no female Members.

Today's Elkdome is different than the Elkdome of years past, and there's an ongoing difference of opinion regarding whether today is the best of times or the worst. This is a debate that can't be won simply because there is merit on both sides, which means we need to find a common ground somewhere between yesterday and today. It is essential that we blend our traditions and customs with a more enlightened manner or forward-looking system of operation that appeals to our entire membership.

Undoubtedly, the past is deserving of respect. Our organization would not be in existence today if not for the "Jolly Corks" and the other architects who established our framework, beliefs, and sense of direction and dedication since the very beginning. Although we sometimes question those who represent the "this is the way we have always done it" group, we must certainly respect their time, work, and perseverance. Their efforts have kept

many Lodges afloat.

However, we must also realize that today's America has changed tremendously since 1868. Heck, it has changed greatly in the last thirty years. It is therefore necessary to accept that the education, ideas, technological abilities, understanding of media, and commitment of our younger Elks are valuable assets that should be tapped for the good and continuation of our Lodges.

Many of today's new Members have much to contribute, but this will not occur if they are not given the chance to participate and assume responsibility. When ignored, many individuals just give up and drop out. Consequently, common sense dictates that we should prepare our new Members for the future through the process of inclusion, not exclusion. Bringing them into our programs and operations and giving their suggestions a try is necessary. After all, like it or not, the reins of control will eventually be inherited by others. It's better to pass the torch to those with whom we have worked, mentored, encouraged, and made connections.

All American contest scores Lodges' activities

What do Elks do? How can my Lodge have a successful year? My Lodge does so much for the community, but it too often goes unrecognized. What can be done about this?

To answer these questions, participate in Contest 'A' — All American Lodge. The contest presents a concise guideline and a quick tabulation of what Elks do. Best of all, the application is only one page long.

The winner of the contest is determined by a score that counts participation in 40 activities. Each activity has a designated value between 5 and 100 points.

Does your Lodge participate in the Elks National Foundation, Hoop Shoot, Elks Memorial Day, the Americanism Contest, scholarships, veterans programs, Drug Awareness activities, CIP grants, or Flag Day, just to list a few? If so, your Lodge is already competitive. Enter the contest!

The contest groups Lodges into six membership divisions and recognizes first, second, and third place winners in each division. Award recipients are

announced annually at the Grand Lodge Convention. Many State Associations provide award recognition at the state level, and all Lodges that participate are winners because they collectively contribute to the success of the Order.

The contest is best approached as a year-long process rather than a year-end "form" to be completed. Letters are sent in July and August to each Exalted Ruler, District Deputy, and State Association Lodge Activities Chair introducing them to the contest and explaining the roles that they perform. Exalted Rulers and Lodge Secretaries must sign the completed application form and send it to their District Deputy postmarked no later than March 15, 2020. District Deputies score their district's entries and forward the six divisional winners to the State Lodge Activities Chair, who forwards the top three state winners in each membership division for national competition.

The All American Lodge Contest is designed to measure what Elks do. If your Lodge participates in the programs and activities listed on the application, it will have a successful year and it will be successful year after year, after year.

Your community will recognize your efforts. Your Lodge will have a steady and lasting positive impact in our area of the world.

Every Lodge that enters the All American Lodge Contest is a winner!



Essay *Writing* Contest

**Kinderhook Lodge of Elks
sponsors Essay Contest.**

Each year, the Kinderhook Lodge of Elks sponsors an essay contest. Students in grade 5 through 8 are separated into two divisions, 5th and 6th grade, and 7th and 8th. Prizes are awarded for the winning essays.

The topic for this year is, "What Does Freedom of Speech Mean to Me?" This is an essential right of our system of government. Let's encourage students to explore our freedom of speech, and appreciate how precious it is.

The rules are as follows:

1. Eligible participants must be enrolled in grades 5th, 6th, 7th, or 8th Grades, during the normal school year preceding June 30, 2020.
2. Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.
3. Essays must be typed, or legibly printed in ink.
4. Essays must be submitted for judging to the Kinderhook Lodge of Elks, PO Box 519, Kinderhook, NY 12106
5. Entrant must be identified on the essay by name, home address, grade, school attended, and the sponsoring Lodge, (Kinderhook #2530)
6. DEADLINE: Essays must submitted by December 15, 2019.
7. Judging Criteria:

Originality: avoid the use of trite, or worn out words, and phrases

Development of Theme: stays focused on ideas, and thoughts; don't ramble.

Mechanics, and Neatness: use proper spelling, grammar, and punctuation.


