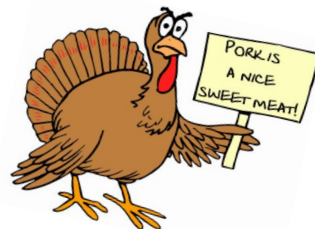
Cigar and Whiskey Night

Cooking with the Elks

Garlic Butter Steak and Potatoes



Ingredients

For the potatoes:

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1-pound medium Yukon Gold or red potatoes, cut into 3/4-inch wedges
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt

For the steak and garlic butter:

- 2 (1-inch-thick) rib-eye or New York steaks (about 12 ounces each), or 1 1/2 pounds flank steak, cut into 2 pieces
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) unsalted butter
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves
- 1 teaspoon freshly squeezed lemon juice, plus more as needed

Instructions

Cook the potatoes: Heat the oil in a 12-inch cast iron skillet over medium heat until shimmering. Add the potatoes cut-side down, sprinkle with the salt, and cook undisturbed until golden-brown and the potatoes release easily from the pan, about 10 minutes. Using tongs, flip each wedge to another cut side and cook until browned and the potatoes are tender, 10 to 15 minutes more.

Meanwhile, dry the steaks with paper towels. Season all over with 1 teaspoon salt and set aside. When the potatoes are ready, transfer to a serving platter.

Cook the steaks: Wipe out the skillet with paper towels and return to high heat until the pan starts to smoke just a bit. Carefully place the steaks in the hot pan and cook on the first side until enough of a crust has developed that the steaks no longer stick to the pan, about 1 minute. Flip and cook on the other side for 1 minute. Continue cooking and flipping for a total of 4 minutes.

Carefully add the butter to the pan. Flip the steaks once more. Tilt the pan so the butter pools on one side and add the garlic to the pool. Use a large spoon to baste the butter over the steaks. Flip again and repeat with basting. Continue cooking and begin checking the internal temperature of the steaks at 6 minutes total cook time for your preferred doneness. Medium rare is between 125°F and 130°F. Remove the pan from the heat.

Transfer the steaks to a clean cutting board and let rest for 5 minutes. Meanwhile, stir the parsley and lemon juice into the juices in the pan. Let cool for a few minutes, then taste and season with more salt and lemon juice as needed. Cut the steaks across the grain into 1/2-inch-thick slices. Place on top of the potatoes and drizzle with the garlic butter pan sauce.

The rules are as follows:

2. Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.
3. Essays must be typed, or legibly printed in ink.
4. Essays must be submitted for judging to the Kinderhook Lodge of Elks, PO Box 519, Kinderhook, N Y 12106
5. Entrant must be identified on the essay by name, home address, grade, school attended, and the sponsoring Lodge, (Kinderhook #2530)
6. DEADLINE: Essays must submitted by [December 15, 2019](#).
7. Judging Criteria:
Originality: avoid the use of trite, or worn out words, and phrases
Development of Theme: stays focused on ideas, and thoughts; don't ramble.
Mechanics, and Neatness: use proper spelling, grammar, and punctuation.

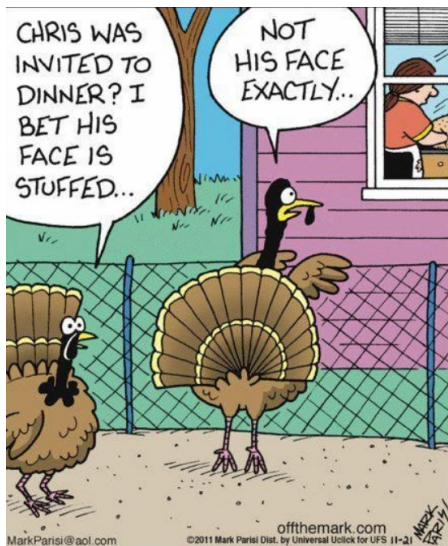

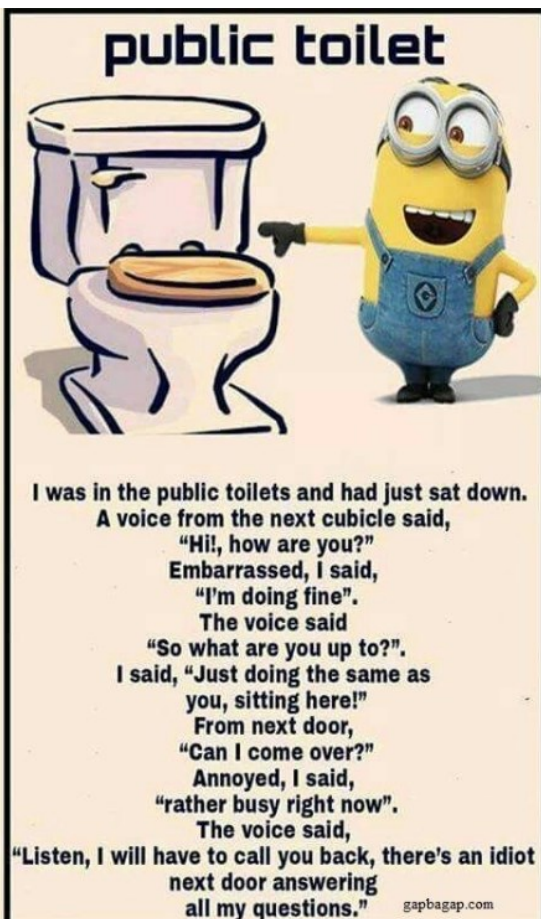
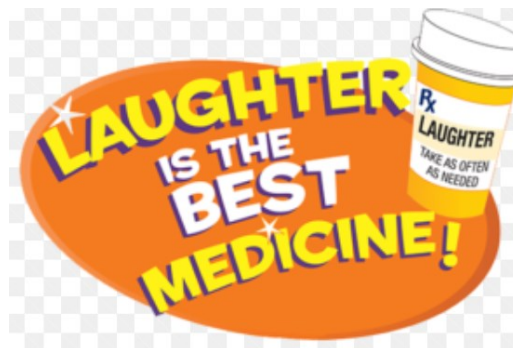

Answers for Questions on Page 3

1. Section 4.461 opinion 01

A district deputy may hold any Lodge office, subject to the conflict of interest rules of the order.

2. Section 10.030

The Chief Justice of the Grand Forum shall be chairman of the Board of Pardon and Commissioners.

3. Section 12.606 opinion 9

It is improper for a Treasurer to sign a number of checks which will permit the Board to approve Lodge bills and fill in the payee and amounts and then cosign the checks.

4. Section 12.120 opinion 2

Each Local Lodge at its annual election must elect an Alternate Representative.

5. Section 12.140

A Lodge May vacate the position of any Officer including a Trustee:

a) Who is absent for meetings of the Lodge, or duty, during two consecutive months without good cause, or

b) Who was replaced by an acting Officer under the provisions of Section 12.020, and determined by the Lodge to be unable to complete his term of office

6. Section 12.140 opinion 1

An Officer arriving after rollcall should be marked present.

7. Section 14.030 opinion 6

To solicit a black-ball of an application of a candidate for membership is a Violation of Obligation and the Laws of the Order.

8. Section 14.060

A Lodge, By-Law may limit its membership. Notwithstanding the limitation, at least one candidate, if available, must be admitted to membership by initiation during the month of September through May, inclusive, of each year.
