RE: Grand Lodge Master Liability Insurance Program for 3/31/20-3/31/21

*The Laws of the Order, Section 4.231*, requires an annual redetermination of the per capita assessment to ensure adequate funding of the Master Liability Insurance Program. Our *Laws* require a Local Lodge to collect the per capita assessment from each Member and from each Life Member. The Lodge is responsible for the payment of the per capita assessment to the Grand Secretary.

Insurance Companies provide excess coverage above the \$1,500,000 Self Insurance Fund. The same policy terms and conditions will remain next year, however the cost will increase. Due to several large claims, the Insurance Companies will increase the premium next year.

To provide adequate funding of the Master Liability Program, the per capita assessment will increase from \$5.00 to \$7.00 for the 3/31/20-3/31/21 policy year. Please make sure that your Lodge budget includes this increase for the fraternal year beginning on April 1, 2020. Thank you.

## JROTC Awards Program recognizes future leaders

The JROTC Awards Program was first introduced at the 2018 Grand Lodge Convention. The purpose of the new program is to give Local Lodges the opportunity to recognize our future leaders by focusing the public's attention on outstanding cadets from their communities.

Does your Lodge participate in this new program? If not, here's the suggested procedure for setting up a JROTC Awards Program:

1. Locate your JROTC Schools by state at the national level through the following websites:

2. Contact the schools in your area that have a JROTC program and ask to speak to the Senior Instructor to see if they would be interested in participating in the Elks' program. If so, request that the instructor selects a worthy cadet: a student who has proven him or herself to be a true leader in academic achievement as well as community service projects, and one who maintains the highest standards of performance in all fields of endeavor. Be sure to coordinate your efforts with other Lodges in your district. You may want to consider making it a district program with all Lodges in your district participating.

3. Inform the instructor that your Lodge will provide a certificate and medal to present to the cadet they select. Your Lodge may want to have Lodge Officers or Members attend the ceremony to make a presentation to the cadet, if permissible.

4. If your Lodge holds a banquet or dinner to recognize outstanding youth in your community, you should consider inviting the cadet and their family to the Lodge for a dinner and recognition.

5. A printable and fillable JROTC certificate is available on the Grand Lodge website under the Activities Committee at: [elks.org/grandlodge/activities/files/JROTCProgram.pdf](https://elks.org/grandlodge/activities/files/JROTCProgram.pdf). The JROTC Medal can be ordered from the Grand Lodge Supplies/Shipping Department by using CLMS. The item number is 575300 and the cost is \$10.00 each, plus shipping and handling. The JROTC medal makes a terrific companion gift to the JROTC certificate. Any cadet will be proud to receive both awards.

## Cooking with the Elks



### Gordie's Blueberry Pie

#### Pie Crust

1 1\4 cups flour  
1 tbsp sugar  
1\2 tsp salt  
3 tbsp shortening chilled  
5 tbsp butter frozen  
4\6 tbsp ice water add water as needed

Should be course make ball and flatten like hockey puck then refrigerate at least 30 min roll out thin

#### Blueberry Pie

9 inch pie  
8 cups blueberries  
1\2 cup sugar  
2 tbsp lemon juice  
2-3 tbsp arrowroot flour or cornstarch  
1\4 tsp salt  
Prebake bottom pie shell at 375 degrees until bottom has started to brown – about 15 to 20 min. separate 1 cup of the blueberries and puree them in a food processor or blender with the sugar, lemon juice and cornstarch. Heat the mixture in a small pot over medium high heat, whisking constantly until the liquid has just thickened – about 1 minute. Pour the mixture over the remaining blueberries and stir to combine. Pour into the bottom crust and top with the upper crust. Bake at 400 degrees for about 25 to 30 minutes.



## Giving proper due to the overlooked Coast Guard

The United States Coast Guard has long participated in numerous conflicts right along with our other branches of the U.S. military. While the Coast Guard used to come under Navy control during major wars, after World War II it was decided that it should function as a separate branch in future conflicts, with a focus on peacetime activities such as search and rescue and the patrol of our country's waterways. As an all-volunteer service, the men and women who serve today come under the auspices of the Department of Homeland Security rather than the US Department of Defense.

The Coast Guard is the only branch of service without a national museum to celebrate its role in the life of our nation and to honor those who serve. Fortunately, in 2004, Congress mandated that a National Coast Guard Museum could be located in New London, Connecticut, the home of the branch's four-year service academy.

The Coast Guard is currently conducting a campaign to build that museum and would appreciate support from the Members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. We anticipate having a U.S. Coast Guard representative

in our Veteran's booth during our Grand Lodge Convention on July 5-8, 2020, in Baltimore, Maryland. The representative will be available to distribute materials and answer questions regarding this outstanding project.

Lodge Members, I encourage you to support not only our Coast Guard members, but also other active-duty military members. Sponsoring activities that involve veterans and active duty military personnel will demonstrate to those who serve us so well that "Elks Care - Elks Share." I'm certain our support will be very much appreciated!




