RE: Grand Lodge Master Liability Insurance Program for 3/31/20-3/31/21

The Laws of the Order, Section 4.231, requires an annual redetermination of the per capita assessment to ensure adequate funding of the Master Liability Insurance Program. Our *Laws* require a Local Lodge to collect the per capita assessment from each Member and from each Life Member. The Lodge is responsible for the payment of the per capita assessment to the Grand Secretary.

Insurance Companies provide excess coverage above the \$1,500,000 Self Insurance Fund. The same policy terms and conditions will remain next year, however the cost will increase. Due to several large claims, the Insurance Companies will increase the premium next year.

To provide adequate funding of the Master Liability Program, the per capita assessment will increase from \$5.00 to \$7.00 for the 3/31/20-3/31/21 policy year. Please make sure that your Lodge budget includes this increase for the fraternal year beginning on April 1, 2020. Thank you.

Did You Know? What the colors in the U.S. Flag stand for?

WHITE: signifies purity and innocence.
RED: signifies hardiness and valor.
BLUE: vigilance, perseverance and justice.



Did You Know? The pledge was first published in 1892. It was reworted in 1923, and 1954. We use the 1954 version today.

Did You Know? To always RAISE the flag on staff briskly? To always LOWER the flag slowly and respectfully?

RAISING OUR FLAG... MEMORIAL DAY: Fly flag at half-staff until noon; then raise to full-staff until sunset. AS A SIGN OF MOURNING: First raise flag to full-staff, then lower to half-staff.


LOWERING OUR FLAG... Don't let the flag touch the ground. Fold as it comes down and before completely detaching it from halyard. From half-staff, flag should be raised to the peak before lowering.

The All American Lodge Contest recognizes the Lodges that have the best administrative Elks programs during the year. Start planning now. With a little effort in filling out the application, your Lodge could be recognized as an All American Lodge, the most prestigious award from the Grand Lodge that a Lodge

can receive.

You will find that many items on the form can be completed immediately. Lodge Officers should work together to complete it. The application must be signed by the Exalted Ruler and the Secretary, and it must be mailed to your District Deputy and postmarked no later than March 15. DDs will verify points

earned and then mail the district winners by April 1 to the State Activities Chairman. The State Activities Chairman will mail the winners to Robert R. Hinkle, 339 Lucy Drive, Harrisonburg, VA, 22801-8050. He can also be reached at hinklerr@yahoo.com.

Three winners are named in each of the six membership divisions. First place Lodges are awarded a plaque, while second and third place Lodges receive a certificate. Plaques and certificates will be presented at the Grand Lodge Convention in Baltimore.

Award recognizes Members who spread Scouting

The Grand Lodge Activities Committee invites all Lodges to nominate one candidate for the **Marvin M. Lewis Award**, the highest award for scouting presented by the Elks. This is awarded to those Elks Members who have been strong promoters of Scouting in their Lodge and have an extensive history in working with Scouts. Four Elks each year are given this prestigious award.

Marvin M. Lewis Awards are presented annually at the Grand Lodge Convention. In addition, presentations can be made at events such as Boy Scouts of America Local Council, an Elks State Convention, or a Local Lodge meeting.

When selecting a candidate for the

Marvin M. Lewis Award, candidates must have the recommendation of their Local Lodge and their local Scouting Council to be eligible. A Lodge should consider Elks who:

1. Have brought Scouting to many young people.
2. Have assisted Lodges in forming Scouting units.
3. Are fully trained in the skills of Scouting and are outstanding role models.
4. Have contributed significantly to Elks and Scouting by bringing the two movements together to serve the community.
5. Have offered Scouting to all youths regardless of race, creed, or income level, and have been

instrumental in organizing Scouting units, especially in inner-city or other low-income communities.

A Grand Lodge selection committee will review candidates and choose qualified recipients. Applications for this award can be found on the Elks website under Grand Lodge Committees and are due on or before March 1. Lodges that submitted an application in the past and were not selected are encouraged to resubmit.

Cooking with the Elks



Fried Chicken

Ingredients

6 chicken thighs
6 chicken drumsticks
3 cups buttermilk
1/2 cup Buffalo Hot Sauce optional
2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon pepper

Dredging Mixture

3 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup cornstarch
1 tablespoon salt
1 tablespoon paprika
2 teaspoons onion powder
2 teaspoons garlic powder
1 teaspoon dried oregano
1 teaspoon dried basil
1 teaspoon white pepper
1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 quart vegetable oil for frying



Instructions

In a large mixing bowl, whisk together buttermilk, hot sauce (optional, for added flavor), salt, and pepper in a mixing bowl. Add in chicken pieces. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and refrigerate 4 hours.

When ready to cook, pour the vegetable oil in a skillet until it is about 3/4 inch deep. Heat to 350 degrees.

Prepare the breading by combining the flour, cornstarch, onion powder, garlic powder, oregano, basil, white pepper, cayenne pepper, paprika, and salt in a gallon sized resealable plastic bag or shallow dish. Mix it thoroughly.

Working one at a time, remove chicken pieces from buttermilk mixture. Shake it gently to remove the excess. Place it in the breading mix and coat thoroughly. Tap off the excess.

Place the breaded chicken into the 350 degree oil. Fry 3 or 4 pieces at a time. The chicken will drop the temperature of the oil so keep it as close to 350 degrees as possible. Fry each piece for 14 minutes, turning each piece over about every 2 minutes, until the chicken reaches an internal temperature of 165 degrees F.

Remove from the oil and place on paper towels. Let them rest for at least 10 minutes before serving.

Tortilla chips have always been considered to be a Mexican food, known as tostados, they were first mass-produced in Los Angeles in the late 1940s. It is said that the triangle-shaped tortilla chips were made popular by Rebecca Webb Carranza as a way to use the misshapen tortillas that were rejected from the automated tortilla manufacturing machine that she and her husband used at their Los Angeles deli and tortilla factory.

Carranza realized that once the discarded tortillas were cut into triangle shapes and fried, they became a popular snack. She then sold them for a dime a bag at the El Zarape Tortilla Factory. Carranza received the Golden Tortilla Award in 1994 for her contribution to the Mexican food industry.
