Welcome Back Members

On Monday, July 6, 2020 after a very long 3 months of closure, the lodge will reopen at 4 pm.

With the lodge reopening comes restrictions which **MUST** strictly be followed.

- 1) The lodge is allowed to operate at 50% capacity. The lounge has been arranged to that number. Bar stools and bar tables cannot be moved! DO NOT move tables/stools.
- 2) ALL Members & guests Must use the game room door to enter and exit the lodge. The 9H door is for employees & deliveries only. Bartenders have been instructed not to buzz anyone in the 9H door. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 3) ALL Members & guests Must sign in at the game room door with your name/phone number. This is for contact tracing in the case that anyone falls sick.
- 4) EVERYONE, this includes Members and guests MUST wear a mask when entering the lodge and keep it on until seated. Masks must be worn upon leaving tables or bar for any reason. NO EXCEPTIONS! The bartender will ask you to keep your mask on until seating.
- 5) Current cards (2020-2021 grey card) MUST be shown when ordering at the bar. If sitting at the bar, your membership cards MUST be in front of you on the bar. If you cannot produce a CURRENT membership card, you will not be served.
- 6) If using the pull tab, lotto or atm machine, it is your duty to wipe down the surfaces you have touched. Disinfecting wipes have been placed by each machine.
- 7) All drinks, draft beer, mixed drinks & wine will be served in plastic cups. NO glasses are to be used.
- 8) No bar food unless individually packaged, i.e. popcorn in bowls, hot dogs, etc. There will be bags of chips, peanuts, etc for purchase.
- 9) NO STANDING AT BAR!!!! You may stand at bar ONLY to order drinks. There will be extra tables set up on the dance floor for members to sit at.

The above restrictions are put in place by New York State during The current Phase reopening guidelines. These are for the protection of everyone.

Please do not ask the bartender on duty to make exceptions, they will not do so.

The bartender will be asking if you have signed the sign in book, again this is for all members and guests. There are bottles of hand sanitizer scattered throughout the lodge, please make use of them.

We know this has been a long 3 months of closure, and if we do not want to close again please follow the above and attached rules.

If there are questions, please do not hesitate to ask a lodge officer or a house committee member. These rules have been developed out of the 40 pages of reopening restrictions and rules put forth by New York State.

Finally, be PATIENT with the bartenders as much of this is new and they have additional duties.

Elks donate 17,000 hides for gloves, craft kits

The Elks ensure that veterans everywhere have the support of the Order and a connection to the community. It may be hard to do that directly right now, but rest assured that the work of Elks volunteers throughout the past year is helping veterans right now.

A perfect example is the Veterans Leather Program, which had another stellar year in 2019-20.

This program brings Elks and community volunteers together to collect hides for veterans. The finished leather is then used for wheelchair gloves, craft kits, and recreation therapy programs.

This past year, Elks and volunteers in 12 states donated 17,234 hides to the Veterans Leather Program. Volunteers helped to collect these hides and transport them to our partners, who turned them into leather.

That leather is turned into wheelchair gloves, and Elks across the country distributed 3,075 pairs of these gloves to veterans. In fact, every year Veterans Leather Program volunteers attend national adaptive sports events to meet with veterans personally and distribute these gloves.

Finished leather is also turned into craft

kits, with a little help from our partner Help Heal Veterans (HHV). This year,

Elks donated more than 83,870 square feet of leather to HHV to make craft kits for veterans.

In return, HHV helped Elks volunteers in State Veterans Homes and elsewhere hand out 10,620 craft kits directly to veterans in their community. With so many activities canceled this year, these craft kits are more popular than ever!

Finished leather is also donated directly to VA Medical Centers, which recreational therapists use to plan

A person wishing to become a member must be proposed in writing by a member of the order, if the person sponsoring the new member does not belong to the same lodge, a certificate from the proposers secretary must accompany the application stating that the proposer is a member in good standing.

Applications must be signed by the applicant, state their name, occupation, date and place of birth, current residence, and employment and residences for the past five years, two references of member of the Order, and whether the applicant has been proposed for membership in another Lodge, if so when, where and what was the result.

Applicant must believe in God, not belonging to or participating in any group that is advocating the overthrow of the government, and must be willing to assume the obligation.

If applicant was not born in the US they must prove they are a citizen of the United States of America. A naturalized individual may still become a member if certain criteria is met. See Section 14.020 for further information.

When voting on an applicant, a white ball is an affirmative vote and a black cube is a negative vote. Applicants must have 2/3rds white balls to be elected to membership, and they have 4 months to complete initiation. For the purposes of initiation is there is one or more meeting nights per month, if a candidate fails to appear for initiation without good cause within those 4 months, their right to initiation shall be forfeited, and no money will be returned to the applicant.

If multiple applications are being voted on and there is not a 2/3rds majority of white balls, each applicant will be voted on separately. If a person is not affirmed, the ER can order a new ballot at the next monthly meeting, the second ballot shall be final. The ballot admission of a candidate shall be strictly inviolate, any member who discloses the ballot is guilty of an offense against the Lodge.
