Elks National Foundation Scholarships

ENF scholarship contests are underway!

Most Valuable Student Scholarship: The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2020 competition. Male and female students compete separately, ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year. Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award, conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.

Applications are available online at www.elks.org/scholars. Completed applications are due on or before November 15, 2020.

NYSEA Education Awards: New York State Elks Association also has a scholarship program. Applicants are children or stepchildren of Elks Lodge members in good standing. The applicant must complete the Most Valuable Student online application and then add the NYS scholarship cover page. All award recipients can reapply for the next 3 years given they keep at least at 3.0 GPA. The NYS cover page is available at the nyselks.org in the Academic Scholarship portion of the website during the same time frame that the MVS application is available. The due dates are the same as the MVS contest. Depending on the year, the NYSEA may award anywhere from 30-50 \$1,000 NYS applications.

Legacy Awards: \$4,000 (\$1,000 year for four years) merit-based scholarships for children and grandchildren of Elks who are members in good standing. Applications will be available online (www.elks.org) starting September 1, 2020 and must be completed prior to February 5, 2021.

Emergency Educational Grants: One-year educational grants are available to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. Completed applications should be filed between May 1st and October 31st.

NYSEA awards over \$100,000 each year in the form of \$1,000 scholarships to deserving students in our Elks families.

Eligibility: High School seniors and current college students who are children or step-children of dues-paying Elks. This scholarship is for undergraduate studies only.

1. Applicants must first apply for the Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship. This is done online at enf.elks.org/MVS

3. Follow instructions on the cover letter to submit your NYS application

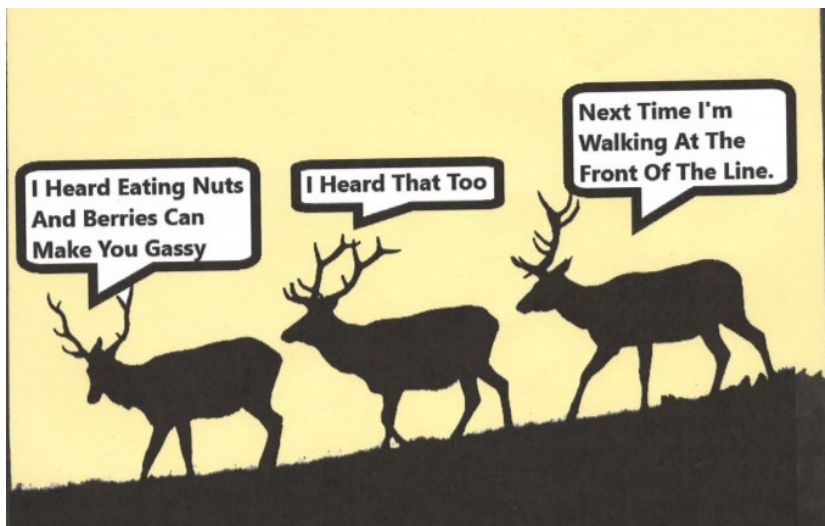

Is your community aware of the great deeds your Lodge does to promote charity and support our veterans? Do they know about our youth programs offered through Hoop Shoot, scholarships, etc.?

The best way to answer these questions is to participate in the Contest "A" – All American Lodge Contest! This year's contest form has been revised and the due date has been extended by two weeks – April 1, 2021.

The application is only one page. Points really add up when you participate in the numerous programs of our Order. Point values range from 5 to 100 and are easily attained. The form has been redesigned this year to address more programs and activities performed by the Lodge throughout the Lodge year. It is a great way to measure the success of your Lodge and to compete against other Lodges in your membership division. The contest is designed to let your Lodge shine and



receive the recognition so deserved of your Members' hard work all year long!

Letters are distributed to Exalted Rulers, District Deputies, and State Association Lodge Activities Chairs introducing them to the contest and explaining their duties. Contest applications must be signed by the Exalted Ruler and Secretary prior to sending to the District Deputy by the deadline date of April 1, 2021.

The District Deputy will score district submissions and forward the winners in each membership division to the State Lodge Activities Chair, who will select the top three state winners in each membership division and forward them for national judging.

Does your Lodge participate in the Americanism Contest, Hoop Shoot, Drug Awareness, CIP grants, Flag Day, and Mother's Day, just to name a few? All of these qualify for entry into the contest!

The contest is grouped into six membership divisions and first, second, and third place winners in each division are recognized. Recipients are announced at the Grand Lodge Convention.

Award honors Members who spread Scouting

The Grand Lodge Activities Committee invites all Lodges to nominate one candidate for the **Marvin M. Lewis Award**, the highest award for scouting presented by the Elks. This is awarded to those Elks Members who have been strong promoters of Scouting in their Lodge and have an extensive history in working with Scouts. Four Elks each year are given this prestigious award.

Marvin M. Lewis Awards are presented annually at the Grand Lodge Convention. In addition, presentations can be made at events such as Boy Scouts of America Local Council, an Elks State Convention, or a Local Lodge meeting.

When selecting a candidate for the Marvin M. Lewis Award, candidates must have the recommendation of their Local Lodge and their local Scouting Council to be eligible. A Lodge should consider Elks who:

1. Have brought Scouting to many young people.
2. Have assisted Lodges in forming Scouting units.
3. Are fully trained in the skills of Scouting and are outstanding role models.
4. Have contributed significantly to Elks and Scouting by bringing the two movements together to serve the community.

5. Have offered Scouting to all youths regardless of race, creed, or income level, and have been instrumental in organizing Scouting units, especially in inner-city or other low-income communities.

A Grand Lodge selection committee will review candidates and choose qualified recipients. Applications for this award can be found on the Elks website under Grand Lodge Committees and are due on or before March 1, 2021. Lodges that submitted an application in the past and were not selected are encouraged to resubmit.

Have you seen the "Elk on the Trail ?



If you want to an enjoyable adventure, take a scenic ride and learn a bit of Elks' history go to Florida, Florida, Massachusetts that is.

About 50 miles from Valatie on Mass route 2 (the Mohawk Trail) stands an impressive sculpture of a regal elk. The monument was erected in 1923 by the Massachusetts Elks Association in honor of Elks from the Commonwealth who gave their lives during the First World War, The eight foot high bronze statue of an elk stands on a three foot high rough cut granite base. The elk holds his head high and has a full rack of antlers.

The memorial was dedicated on June 17, 1923. At that time a time capsule was also buried to be opened 100 years later. The opening is not that far off, it's scheduled to occur in June of 2022.



Recently, Jim McKay and Larry Eleby spent an afternoon with friends riding motorcycles and visited the "Elk on the Trail". The ride over to Florida from Valatie took about an hour-and-fifteen minutes by way of route 22 in NY and routes 43, 7 and 2 in Mass.

That is through New Lebanon in Stephentown, New York and Hancock, Williamstown and North Adams in Mass. It was quite a scenic ride and the monument which is on the side of route 2 at the top of Whitcomb summit is impressive to all and especially meaningful to member Elks.

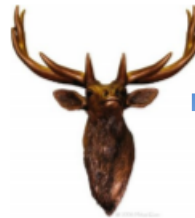

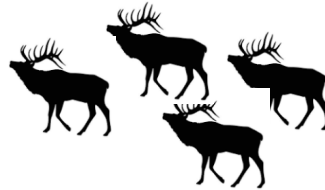

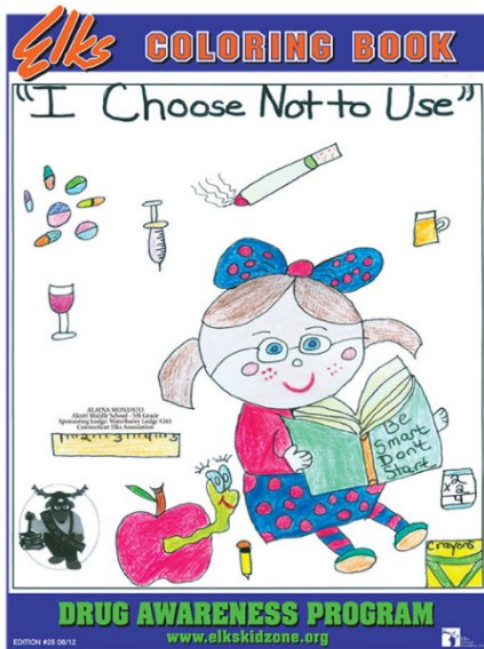
Have you Paid your Lodge Dues?

Local Lodges

A local lodge can be instituted only as provided in the Constitution and Statutes, however a lodge with not consist of less than 25 members

Officers are

Exalted ruler same as the President of a company

Esteemed Leading Knight would be the First VP

Esteemed Loyal Knight would be 2nd VP

Esteemed Lecturing Knight would be 3rd VP

Secretary, treasurer, Esquire, tiler, chaplain, and Inner Guard, Trustees of not less than 3 or more than 5 and other officers authorized by Statute, All of whom are elected or appointed. The office will be help for such terms as provided by the Statute. Titles shall be used inside the Lodge, when dealing with non-Elks, President and Vice-President terms will be used.

During a meeting with a membership of over 100, 9 is the magic number to have a quorum, if the Lodge has less than 100 members 7 members constitutes a quorum.

Membership is limited to US citizens, who will pledge allegiance to and salute the Flag, are 21 years of age or older, and other qualifications mandated by the statute.

Local Lodges have territorial jurisdiction, fixed by Statute.

Fees of the Lodge are determines by the By-law, but shall not be less than the minimum fees fixed by the Laws of the Order

Each Lodge must display its Charter in the Lodge room when in session.

Each Lodge shall have general jurisdiction over its members, and any one holding a limit, or unaffiliated elks formerly on the rolls, their power shall be to their lodge as long as it does not conflict with the Laws of the Order

The Lodge name shall come from the city, village or community in which the Lodge is located, and its serial number , unless ordered to be different by the Grand Lodge.

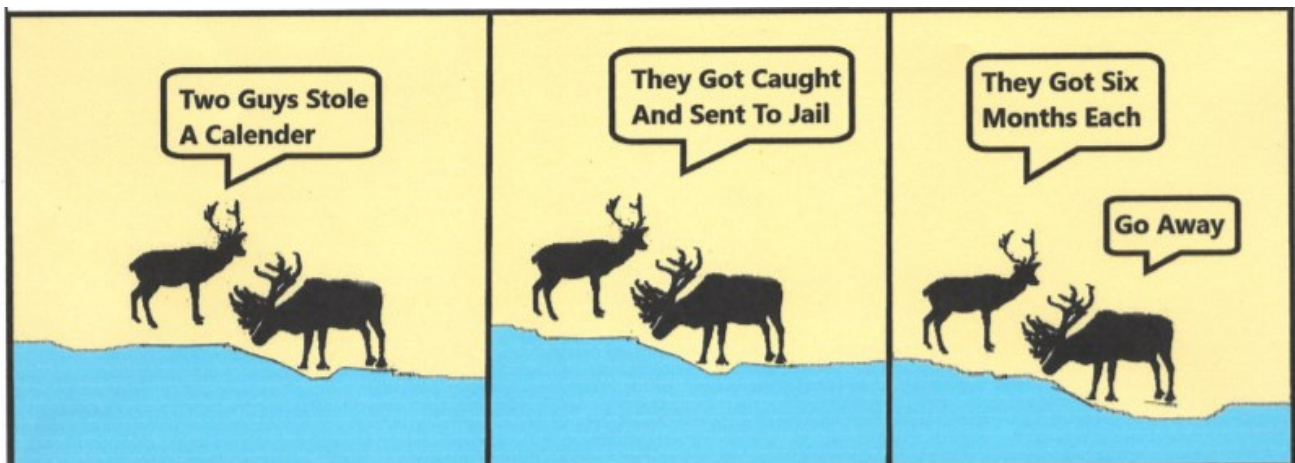

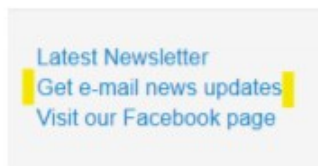
Sign Up for Lodge Communications

If the email **Mailing List Manager** is NOT in your inbox, check your SPAM folder. You will need to mark the email NOT SPAM and then follow step 5.

These captions are then sent to your phone. There is a cost for each minute of captions generated, paid from a federally administered fund.
