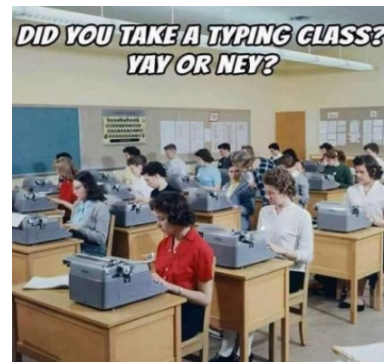
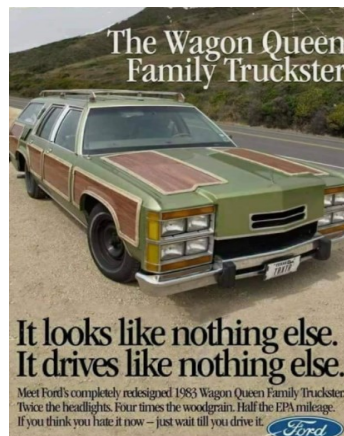

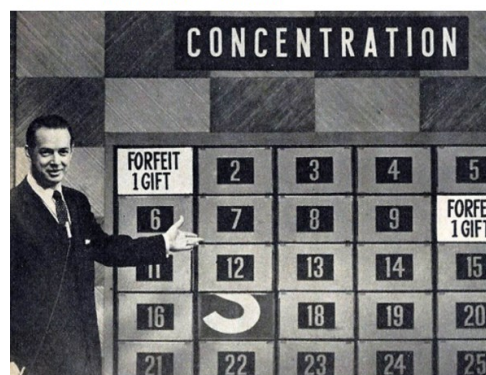

Golf Balls Update

Dear State Vice Presidents,

I hope that this email finds all of you well. The reason for this email is that there has been a change in how we are to package the golf balls we donate to Bunkers in Baghdad. WE CAN NO LONGER PUT THEM IN BAGS, BUCKETS OR BOXES OF ANY TYPE. Due to Joe Hanna having to move from his storage facility on Grand Island, we NEED TO USE USPS FLAT RATE BOXES!!!

You can get them at your local Post Office for free and they should hold 175-190 golf balls. This will help Joe as he now has limited space to store them and it will be easier to ship them right out to the Troops. Also this will be my preferred method of collecting golf balls at future Conventions. At the moment I don't know about golf clubs, but as I get more information on this I will pass it on to you. So for the present let's stick to golf balls until Joe's situation becomes clearer and more settled.

Now to update you on our donations as we head into year five of supporting Bunkers. Even during the pandemic, we still managed to collect 18,787 golf balls from across the State. Our total now stands at 109,469 golf balls, 922 clubs, 12 practice nets, 2 practice mats, 27 bags (we no longer take them) and other various golf equipment. The value of our donation's totals: \$65,721.00. So let us continue to support Bunkers and our Troops.
