To my Kinderhook Elks Family,



QUEEN OF HEARTS GAME OPEN TO ALL

Rules - The game consists of a standard deck of cards with 2 (two) jokers for a total of 54 cards. Cards are shuffled, numbered 1 through 54, and placed in an envelope in the locked cabinet. Tickets are sold for \$1.00 (one dollar) each or \$5.00 for 6 tickets. Your name, phone number and envelope number go on each ticket, then place in the drum.

On drawing day (**Friday at 7pm.**), we will do a Facebook Live Event where you can see the drawing take place. A random person will pull one ticket from the drum. Then, we will pull the corresponding numbered envelope from the board. All other tickets in the drum will be discarded.

If that number reveals the Queen of Hearts, then that person wins 60% of the pot and the game has ended. The rest of the cards will be removed, and a new deck of cards will be put in its place and a new game will begin. Payout is in the form of a check from the Lodge. 

Most Valuable Student

The 2022 application will open on August 2, 2021.

Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants **do not** need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.

Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

The 2022 application deadline will be November 15, 2021 at 11:59 p.m., Pacific Time

Awards:

- The Elks National Foundation will award 500 four-year scholarships to the highest-rated applicants in the 2022 competition.
- Male and female students compete separately.
- Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.
- The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation will announce the 500 national winners in late April, 2022. (Many local Lodges, districts and state Elks associations award their own scholarships through this program. These scholarships are not to be confused with the 500 Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarships.)
- The 20 Top Finalists traditionally* participate in an all expenses paid Leadership Weekend in Chicago during which they'll interview with the national judges. These 20 Finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive awards of \$20,000. The 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000.

Ever since I got interested in John Kennedy and his service on the PT 109 I have taken time to research any ship's history that I come across when meeting Navy Veterans. It's just a small hobby and I like history and when you find information out about Navy War ships you find a lot of brave men with a lot of history behind the ships.

When I became reacquainted with Gordy Engel and found out he had served on the USS Fremont APA-44. I went to work researching his ship.

I found a long crews list and I found Walter Engel and his enlisted time on the ship. The USS Fremont was an attack launch ship. It had made 10 successful attack launches in a row,

Fremont earned the coveted Amphibious Assault Award for 13 consecutive years. She is the only ship in the Navy to have accomplished this.

I also came across decals for sale of the ship and gave him two of them. To make up for the time I stole his pizza. (Another whole Story).

Not long after, I was talking to Dave Riffley and found out he served on the USCG Cape Kiwanda 95329 - a 95 foot patrol boat. He had told me, much to his dismay, that the ship was given to Cambodia. I found it hard to believe that the US Navy would give a ship to an enemy so I started to research the USCG Cape Kiwanda 95329. What I found out was unbelievable and much to Dave's enlightenment. His ship was actually given to South Korea In May of 1969, not Cambodia. I printed him the story and the news release photo of the transfer.

After telling this story to Anne she asked me to write it up for the newsletter. At some future date I will write the story of the stolen pizza.

Community Projects Contest recognizes volunteer work

As we start to emerge from the hibernation we have been dealing with for the last 18 months, it is time to once again interact with our local communities to fill their needs and promote Elksdom's great deeds.

Our communities desperately need assistance that local governments are challenged to provide at this time. Connecting with members of the community in these projects also introduces them to the Elks and the many wonderful programs and activities we do.

The Grand Lodge Community Projects Contest is a way for your Lodge and your Members to gain recognition for this hard work. It is encouraged that you identify a need in your community, develop a plan to address the need, and solicit volunteers to follow through with the plan. Try to engage both Members and non-Members in both developing your plan and putting it into action. This builds relationships, fosters goodwill, and can result in new Members joining your Lodge. Try to identify a program that can grow from year to year and be an icon of what your Lodge stands for in the community.

The Community Investment Program administered by ENF provides many grants that can be used in your program. The \$3,500 Beacon Grant is perfectly suited for continuing active projects. You can merge the Spotlight Grant with the Beacon Grant, which provides \$5,500 total. Or, your Lodge can start a program with other CIP grants. Visiting the ENF Community Investment Programs page on elks.org can provide past examples of projects that have been successful.

Be active in your project; don't just give a check to a project or organization. The best reward comes not only from providing for your community but from engaging with it. These relationships are what build the foundation for strong and proud communities.

Get recognition for your Lodge and Members by applying for the Community Project Contest. The Committee awards first, second, and third place in each of the six membership categories based on the size of your Lodge. The categories have been restructured this year to balance the categories with each having roughly the same number of Lodges. It does not matter how large or small your Lodge may be—you will be competing against Lodges your own size. The form is a fillable PDF

that can be completed, saved, and e-mailed to the project coordinator, whose contact information is listed on the form.

The contest is based on criteria such as number of Lodge people involved; number of man-hours; number of days for the event; number of newspaper articles; number of social media messages; and number of signs posted. There is a point value for each item. It could not be easier.

Applications are due to the project coordinator listed on the application by April 1, 2022, but don't wait until then to submit. Once the project is completed fill out the form and submit it then. You can e-mail or mail the completed form. If e-mailed, please provide a few .jpeg photos that depict the nature of the project with your community. Reward your Members and receive publicity for your Lodge at the Grand Lodge Convention.

AMERICANISM ESSAY CONTEST

Essay Theme: "What does it mean to love your country?"

1. Eligible participants must be a student enrolled in the fifth, sixth, seventh or eighth grade during the normal 2021-22 school year, preceding June 30, 2022. **Deadline:** Must be submitted to Local Lodge by December 15, 2021.
2. Essay length is not to exceed 300 words.
3. Essay must be typed or legibly printed in ink. Also, Essay must be submitted as written (or typed) by the entrant.
4. Essay must be submitted for judging to the Elks Lodge administering the contest at his or her school or, if unknown, to Lodge nearest to home address of entrant.
5. Entrant must be identified on essay by name, home address, grade, school attended and sponsoring Lodge. (Lodge may enter Lodge information on essay.)
6. Judging criteria:
Originality: Avoid the use of trite or worn out words and phrases – 30 points
Development of theme: Stay focused on ideas and thoughts. Don't ramble – 40 points
Mechanics and neatness: Use proper spelling, grammar and punctuation – 30 points

There are two divisions for judging essays:

Division 1 (combined fifth and sixth grades)
Division 2 (combined seventh and eighth grades)

PROCEDURES FOR LODGE AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select from submitted entries the top three essays from each division and send the six essays to the District Americanism Chairman by Jan. 31, 2022, or the date established by the State Association.

PROCEDURES FOR DISTRICT AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select the top three essays in each division from entries submitted by Local Lodges and send the six essays to the State Americanism Chairman by Feb. 28, 2022, or the date established by the State Association.

PROCEDURES FOR STATE AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN

Select the first-, second- and third-place winners for the state from entries submitted by the District Chairman. In addition, State Chairman forwards the first-place winners from each division to the Grand Lodge Essay Contest Administrator. (Must be postmarked by March 31, 2022.)

Plaques for first-, second-, and third-place winning essays in Divisions I and II will be available for pickup at the Fraternal Committee's Booth at the end of the Grand Lodge Session on July 5, 2022.


