### Subscribing is a three step process:

The confirmation email usually arrives within 60 seconds. If you don't see it, check your junk mail folder.

If you haven't received a confirmation after 5 minutes, it's possible your email provider has rejected it as spam. You could try contacting their help desk but a simpler solution is to use a different email address. G-mail, AOL, Yahoo, Fairpoint, Hotmail, Taconic, and many other addresses will work. Approximately 150 members have subscribed to our emails.

**Unsubscribing** follows the same three steps but select “Please remove me” before clicking *Send* in step one.




