

To our Absent Members

John McBride Utley, 81, of Kinderhook NY passed away on Saturday July 6, 2024 at his home in Kinderhook, NY. John was born on Christmas day, 1942, in Hudson to Samuel and Luciel (Johnson) Utley.

He was known for his speed and athleticism at Ichabod Crane and graduated from there to go on to Farmingdale State College where he earned his associate in applied science for Heating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration Technology. He then worked at GE for two years. He bought a brand-new red Sting Ray corvette and drove it across the country to San Luis Obispo and then sold it to pay for his tuition at California Polytechnic Institute. He graduated as an engineer in Heating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration. Upon graduation he worked for American Air Filter (AAF International) in St. Louis, Missouri for a number of years before joining Porg Warner, Johnson Controls, in York, PA. While in York, John joined York Barbell and trained as a weightlifter with many Olympic athletes. He was very close to being selected as a US Olympic competitor in the clean and jerk.

John returned to Kinderhook to help care for his mother and worked in construction and remodeling for many years in Kinderhook and the surrounding areas. His skill and pride in hanging and taping sheet rock was well known and he worked on many detailed, complex, and difficult older home restorations. He was a perfectionist and would often sheet rock or tape for friends and family so that it was done correctly.

John was a member of the Kinderhook Elks Lodge 2530 for decades and always worked the Sunday breakfasts and directed cars for parking at the Columbia County Fair each year.

John loved music – classic rock from the 50s and 60s and country music; animals of all shapes and sizes, especially Rottweilers and just about any cat he could get his hands on; restoring and showing off his Edsels; listening to Yankee and Phillies games on the radio; and cruises to just about anywhere.

John McBride Utley is survived by his sister, Judith (the Rev. LeRoy Suess) Utley-Suess, of Glenmont NY, niece Laura (Edward) McCullen of Melrose, NY and her children Kimberly Salvati (Leyton Spencer) of Stamford, CT, Natalie Salvati of Brooklyn, NY, and Sam Salvati of Melrose NY as well as many beloved cousins.







Learn about the Lodge Officer Roles

Exalted Ruler – Anne Leiser - The Exalted Ruler is the "Chief Executive" of the Lodge and is responsible for effectively administering the affairs of the Lodge and providing the leadership necessary to accomplish Lodge goals. The Exalted Ruler also serves the local Lodge delegate to the Grand Lodge Convention.

The Knights – Tammy McDermott, Kelly McGiffert, Rose Nikles - The Knights - Leading Knight, Loyal Knight, and Lecturing Knight - assist the Exalted Ruler in conducting the affairs of the Lodge.

Secretary – Jerry Shook - The Lodge Secretary has a variety of administrative responsibilities, including the maintenance of Lodge membership records. The Lodge Secretary - along with the Exalted Ruler, Leading Knight, and Trustee Chairperson - is required to attend training clinics conducted by the District Deputy.

Treasurer -Joe Laviano - The Lodge Treasurer pays all approved bills and is required to maintain an accurate record of receipts and disbursements.

Board of Trustees – Ben Lasher, Chris Akers, John Sundwall, Thom McDermott, John Piddock - The three-to-five-member Board of Trustees meets at least once each month to oversee the funds, investments and property of the Lodge.

Tiler -Larry Knott - The Tiler is responsible for guarding the outer door during lodge meetings and must be thoroughly familiar with the laws and rituals of the Order.

Esquire -John Dean - The Lodge Esquire is responsible for organizing the Lodge for meetings, including the preparation of candidates for initiation, and introducing visiting Members.

Chaplain -Sharon Deck - At most Lodges, it is customary for the Lodge Chaplain to perform invocations and benedictions at various lodge functions.


Inner Guard -Jeannie Engel - The Inner Guard may perform various duties required by the Laws of the Order, or the By-Laws of the Lodge.

Organist – John Dean - The Organist provides the music prescribed by the rituals of the Order.
