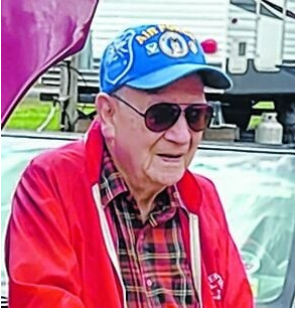

To our absent members

Raymond T. Chuley, 89, passed away peacefully on February 9, 2025.

Ray was born in Valatie, New York on September 12, 1935, to John Chuley and Carrie (Edwards) Chuley. He attended school in Albany, New York and graduated from Albany High School in 1953. He enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1954 and honorably served as a Communications Specialist in Okinawa and Texas until his discharge in 1958.

After Raymond's completion in the Air Force, he worked at Freihofer's Bakery and then began his drafting career at Sterling Drug in Rensselaer, New York. During his employment at Sterling, he completed his apprenticeship at Hudson Valley Community College and graduated with his Associate degree in 1973. He retired from Sterling after 29 years of employment and continued his drafting career with JB Warren Industries in Castleton-on-Hudson, New York for another 11 years until he officially retired.

Ray met the woman-of-his-dreams in 1978, and married Shirley (Weaver) Santana on August 25, 1979. They shared their love of traveling and family until her passing in March, 2014.

Outside of working, Ray pursued his passion for trains with an extensive collection of HO scale model railroading. His love for the Air Force continued with a vast knowledge of military aircraft, and was known for his expertise of World War 2. During his younger years, he loved fishing on Lake Champlain in Rouses Point, New York and hunting in Oneonta, New York with his relatives.

Ray's legacy will continue by John T. Chuley (son), Christine (Luciano) Chuley (daughter-in-law), Kirsten N. Chuley (granddaughter), Timothy A. Santana (step-son), and Linda (Bosley) Santana (step daughter-in-law), and numerous cousins and grandchildren.

He was predeceased by his parents John and Carrie, his wife Shirley, his step-daughter Mary Santana, and his grandson Erik.

COXSACKIE—On a freezing February morning in 2018, Ella Schoenborn passed a homeless man on her way to school. He was sleeping under a piece of snow-covered cardboard and at that moment the then nine-year-old from Coxsackie knew she had to help.

Schoenborn embarked on a mission that day to feed the hungry and founded what would grow to become Projectella. It started as a simple sandwich-making operation in her home and ballooned into the distribution of more than 7,300 meals and 250,000 food pantry items. And her work has not gone unnoticed.

On Monday, U.S. Rep. Marc Molinaro (NY-19) presented Schoenborn with a congressional proclamation for her outstanding achievements, exceptional character, and unwavering dedication to her community. Schoenborn was joined at the congressman's Leeds office by her family, Academy of Holy Names school officials, classmates and friends, as well as Greene County Legislative Chairman Pat Linger and Sheriff Peter Kusminsky.

"Often, we think of leadership as standing in front of a room. And sometimes that's what it is. But most of the time it's a single act that balloons into great movements," Molinaro said.

Molinaro spoke of Eleanor Roosevelt, the longest serving first lady of the United States and first chairperson of the Commission on Human Rights for the United Nations.

"She said all the great movements in time, in society, begin in small places. Meaning that simple acts often are where the big change occurs," Molinaro said.

"And I can tell already, some of the small things you have done ballooned into bigger things," he told Schoenborn.

"The best leaders are the people who meet people where they are and help them to get where they need to be," Molinaro said.

After school on that cold winter day nearly seven years ago, Schoenborn gathered up bottles and cans to redeem for five-cent deposits. With \$20.50 in hand and the help of her dad, Gus Schoenborn, she made eight turkey and cheese sandwiches and gave them out to those living on the streets of Albany.

Before long, she was feeding the homeless three days a week in Albany, Troy, and Saratoga. And by the end of the first summer, she was making 200 turkey sandwiches a week.

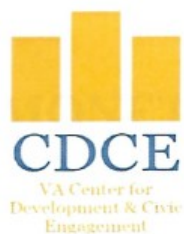
Sixteen different organizations and food pantries across six counties have benefited from Schoenborn's work, and she has developed a network of distributors and agencies to ensure that goods are delivered to those in need—averaging 300-500 people helped every week.

As Schoenborn says, "You can't dream if you are hungry."

The congressional proclamation is one of several awards Schoenborn has received over the years, including from the Greene County Legislature, New York State Assembly, New York State Senate, Greene County Sheriff's Office, and YWCA NorthEastern NY.

Schoenborn was also the recipient of the 2022-2023 Youth Virtues, Valor, and Vision Award from the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) for selfless service, determination, innovation, and ideals that are changing the world. She was chosen from more than 1.6 million Catholic school students across the country.

When she is not busy feeding the hungry, Schoenborn serves as her class president, an officer with the National Honor Society maintaining a 4.0 GPA, and a captain of the varsity lacrosse team.
