By-Law amendment proposal notification

Per Section 17.060 of the GLS the following is a

Proposal to amend current By-Laws

Article IV : MEETINGS.

As follows:

Section 1

The regular Lodge meetings of this Lodge shall be held on the fourth Monday of each month throughout the year, except the months of February, March and April which will be held on the second and fourth Mondays

The new prices will come into effect on Friday, May 2, 2025. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and appreciate your understanding and ongoing support.

As we enter the new year, we would like to remind all members of the House Rules established within our lodge. In accordance with the Grand Lodge statutes, self-service of alcohol in any form, including the use of beer pitchers, is strictly prohibited. Only authorized bar staff are permitted to dispense alcohol at all times. Additionally, it is highly recommended that all bartenders complete the New York State TIPS Training in order to maintain their eligibility for bartending duties. We appreciate your attention to these important guidelines.

HOUSE RULES

1. The Bartender is ultimately in charge of the Lounge during its Hours of Operation.
2. All Members must show a valid Membership Card to the Bartender in order to be served.
3. Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests.
4. At all times, non-members shall be escorted by a Member holding a valid Membership Card. Nonmembers, who arrive before their escorts, may wait in the Lounge area, but shall not sit at the bar until either his/her escort arrives or another valid Member offers to be his/her escort and agrees to remain with him/her.
5. Whenever possible, all beverages and food, consumed in or on Lodge property, shall be purchased through the House Committee or the Committee sponsoring the function.
6. For reasons of safety and control, the use of the Lodge and Lounge area during the Hours of Operation will be at the discretion of the Bartender. The Bartender may defer action to a House Committee member in attendance or Lodge Officer in attendance should he/she so choose to do so.
7. The Bartender has the right and obligation to refuse to serve anyone whom he/she feels has abused his/her privileges or whom he/she feels has over indulged. Bartenders should never allow self-service of alcohol under any circumstance; and should never serve drinks to anyone not escorted by a Member in good standing. Anyone who serves alcohol should receive training from one of the many available courses that certify bartenders. Bartenders shall not sell, deliver, or give away or procure to be sold, delivered or given away, any alcoholic beverages to any person, actually or apparently, under the age of twenty-one years; to any visibly intoxicated person; to any habitual drunkard known to be such to the person authorized to dispense any alcoholic beverages. Bartenders shall refrain from consuming alcohol while on duty.
8. Opening the Lounge at times, other than the posted Hours of Operation, may not be done without the permission of a House Committee member. There must be a qualified Bartender present to assume the responsibility for operating the bar.
9. When a qualified Bartender cashes out, the bar is officially closed. Everyone must exit the bar area. No one is to re-open the bar unless there is a qualified Bartender present who is willing to re-open the Lounge and assume all responsibilities for re-closing.
10. Violation of House Committee Rules may result in suspension of privileges.
11. No one under, the age of twenty-one (21), is allowed to sit at the bar or make purchases.
12. Smoking is not permitted in the Lodge. Smoking may occur in the designated area provided outside.
13. Safety, common sense, and courtesy should apply at all times. In case of questions, the Bartender, House Committee member, or Lodge Officer (in that order) will render a decision.
14. No player has the right to monopolize a gam; and may be challenged at any time.
15. No child shall be left unescorted or unsupervised in the Game Room.
16. On busy nights, children may not use the Game Room or be in the Lounge area after 10:00 PM. Use of the gaming equipment is at the discretion of the Bartender.
17. The over service or consumption of alcohol as defined by local law or ordinance is strictly prohibited; this rule shall be applicable to all Members, Officers, and employees of the Lodge pursuant to Grand Lodge Statute 17.052.

Essay 1: Tell us your connection to the Elks

My grandfather, Walden F. Brough, has been a part of the Kinderhook Elks Lodge in New York since my mother was young. My mother told me how important the Elks Lodge was to her when she was growing up with helping pack Thanksgiving baskets for those in need, providing basketball hoop contests for youth and being a part of the community. My mom was also named Elks Student of the Year for her high school. Our family has celebrated many important celebrations at local Elks lodges including my parents' wedding reception in Gloucester, MA (I wasn't there for that one), my Grandparents' 50th Wedding Anniversary and my Grandfather's Lifetime Achievement Award with the Valatie Volunteer Fire Department in Kinderhook, NY and my Mom's 40th Birthday in Billerica, MA. I know that the Elks uses their banquet service fees to help their fundraising efforts for local projects. I drive by the Billerica Elks Lodge on my way to my job at a local supermarket and I always see a lot of cars in the parking lot, so I know they are always helping host an event or fundraiser to help others.

Essay 2: Tell us about a volunteer activity where you have seen growth

My favorite sport to play is basketball and I attended the Shawsheen Tech Basketball Summer Camp for many years. When I was accepted as a student at Shawsheen Valley Technical High School I knew I wanted to be involved with the basketball program that taught me so much. It was a tough day when I found out I did not make the Freshman Basketball team, but I immediately went to see the Varsity Basketball coach to ask if I could be the Team's Manager. My parents weren't so sure if that was a good idea, but I really wanted to be involved, even if it meant I wouldn't play. That has turned out to be the best decision I ever made. I have learned so much about helping players develop, understanding the statistics of the game and supporting the coaching staff. My favorite part of being the Team Manager is that every summer I am a Camp Counselor at the Basketball Camp that meant so much to me growing up. I help coach the campers, come up with various drills and help them improve their skills. In college I plan to major in Sports Management with a basketball operations focus.

Essay 3: If you could have dinner with someone from American history who would it be and why? What would you discuss?

While basketball is my favorite sport to play, the first sport I remember watching with my family is baseball. If I were to have dinner with someone from American history I would want to have a meal with baseball player, Jackie Robinson and I'd like to take my grandfather, Wally, with me. I live in the Boston area, so all of my father's family are Red Sox fans, but my mother grew up in upstate New York and my Grampy was a Brooklyn Dodgers fan, but more importantly he will always be a Jackie Robinson fan. When my Grampy was ten years old he went with his father to see his first baseball game in person and Jackie hit a home run which had their opponent, the NY Giants, scrambling on the Giants' home field at the Polo Grounds. That hit sealed the deal on my grandfather's love of baseball. In 2022, as a gift we took my grandfather to see the Jackie Robinson Museum in New York City and I learned so much that I hadn't realized about what Jackie did for baseball, who he was as a person and all he accomplished in his short life. I think the first question I would ask Jackie Robinson is "What is your favorite sport?" I learned at the museum that he played four sports at UCLA: football, basketball, track and baseball and I wonder if he liked any of them more than the others. I know he was the first African American to play Major League Baseball which opened so many opportunities for others, but was it the sport he enjoyed the most? I would then ask him about what it felt like to play in front of such a large crowd and how he could play under so much pressure. Then I would want to know how he was able to keep playing when so many people were cruel to him because of the color of his skin. I know this probably would be a tough question, but he didn't give up even when so many were against him playing in the major leagues. I have never experienced anything like that and I don't know if I could keep going like he did. Jackie Robinson definitely paved the way for all African American athletes in all sports and I would want to know what he felt still needed to be done to help athletes be treated fairly in today's leagues. After chatting with Jackie Robinson about his influence on American sports, I would want to know about how he succeeded in business from being the vice president of a coffee company to helping start a bank for African American individuals to start their own businesses. I wish Jackie Robinson was still alive so I could have that dinner with him. It would be really interesting to talk with him about all he experienced and I know my favorite part would be having my Grampy meet his favorite player.
